As the true cornerstone of our collective identity, arts and culture are essential to our individual and collective development. Through this report, you will learn how the past year has allowed tens of thousands of people from all walks of life to discover art without social, economic, cultural, or functional barriers standing in their way.

The growth of Place des Arts' Education and Communities sector is a testament to the major role this institution plays in the city's artistic and cultural ecosystem, offering increased access to the arts and culture for an ever-growing number of people and fostering connections between communities.

Rooted in its mission, the Fondation de la Place des Arts is committed to supporting the vitality of this sector and the sustainability of its many programs and activities. As such, we are pleased to see that our fundraising revenue has increased by nearly 7% this year compared to last year.

This growth is the result of a successful annual fundraising event, coupled with the initiative of a third party that gave us the opportunity to hold an online auction—a first for our organization. It also stems from the positive relationships we have built with major partners over the past few years. These have resulted in, among other things, major multi-year donations, which this year include an exceptional gift of more than half a million dollars over three years from the Sandra and Alain Bouchard Foundation.

The philanthropic community relies heavily on the contribution of committed volunteers. In this regard, I would like to highlight the arrival of three new administrators and express my gratitude to the president and members of the board for their continued support.

Finally, I would like to thank all the donors and partners who have generously contributed to supporting our mission and our achievements. Without you, none of this would be possible.

An Exceptional Donation

The Sandra and Alain Bouchard Foundation confirmed a major donation of \$541,410 over three years for the implementation of activities in the Adaptive Arts program.

As the program's partner since its inception in 2019, the Sandra and Alain Bouchard Foundation has to date given more than 1,200 people living with functional limitations the opportunity to participate in inclusive performing arts projects.

Endowment Fund

Thanks to the Ministère de la Culture et des Communications du Québec's matching program (initiated in 2020), the Fondation was able to lay the groundwork for an endowment fund. The program, which ended this year, allowed the Fondation to benefit from an average match of 128% and to increase the value of its fund to more than \$3.2 million in five years.

A Program Dedicated to High School Students

School Program

For over 10 years, this program has connected high school students to performing arts disciplines through in-class workshops and a performance at Place des Arts, followed by a discussion with the project's main artist.

With the collaboration of an established community of artist-mediators, the activities correlate with the school curriculum, allowing students to acquire key skills for their academic and social success, while transforming their outlook on art and the world around them.

More than half of the students who participated in the program attend a school with a high Deprivation Index rating (8 to 10). These schools welcome a significant number of young people from immigrant backgrounds who reflect the 120 cultural communities from five continents that are present in Montreal.



A Program that Stands Out

Adaptive Arts Program

Launched in 2019, Adaptive Arts Program has been designed to give people living with functional limitations or in situations of social exclusion a space in which they can express themselves. The program is constantly evolving to adapt ever more precisely to their needs and to foster cultural inclusion.

Every year, the Esplanade is transformed into an outdoor dance floor where the public is invited to learn the dances and musical rhythms of various cultures. With the participation of professional musicians and dancers, these activities bring together citizens from all walks of life and foster dialogue between communities.

Presented as part of Montréal en lumière 2024, Nuit Blanche at Place des Arts featured a poetry component supported by the Fondation and produced in collaboration with the Université du Québec à Montréal. Over the course of an evening punctuated with musical performances, local artists read, recited, slammed, chanted, intoned, and otherwise set the tempo for their words and poems, bringing them to life with their wonderful voices.

Under the artistic direction of virtuoso cellist Stéphane Tétreault, the 13th edition of the Fondation's annual benefit event was a resounding success. The event's co-chairs, Sylvie Chagnon (Lallemand), Sandra Chartrand (Sandra and Alain Bouchard Foundation), and Jacques Marchand (LCI Education) were proud to announce the amount raised through the generosity of the 500 or so businesspeople, philanthropists, and cultural stakeholders gathered at Théâtre Maisonneuve on June 4.
